




Vhy Work?

WISDOM from PROVERBS

Proverbs tells us that working is a fundamental ingredient in living a fulfilled life.



<u>Genesis 2:15</u> The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to work it and take care of it.

<u>Genesis 2:7</u> Then the Lord God formed the man out of the dust from the ground and breathed the breath of life into his nostrils, and the man became a living being.

2. Choose to make a <u>DIFFERENCE</u>.

<u>Genesis 12:2</u> and I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, **so that you will be a blessing**.

a. That means choosing meaningful work.

The habit of thinking about work as something one does to make money is so ingrained in us that we can scarcely imagine what a revolutionary change it would be to think about it instead in terms of the work done. I am also frightened by the phrase "after the war" – it is so often pronounced in a tone that suggests: "after the war, we want to relax, and go back, and live as we did before."

And that means going back to the time when labor was valued in terms of its cash returns, and not in terms of the [meaning of the]work.




