### The Wrath of God.

John 18 1:14 When he had said these things,

Jesus went out with his disciples across the Kidron Valley. There was an orchard there, and he and his disciples went into it. <sup>2</sup> (Now Judas, the one who betrayed him, knew the place too, because Jesus had met there many times with his disciples.) <sup>3</sup> So Judas obtained a squad of soldiers and some officers of the chief priests and Pharisees. They came to the orchard with lanterns and torches and weapons.

<sup>4</sup> Then Jesus, because he knew everything that was going to happen to him, came and asked them, "Who are you looking for?" <sup>5</sup> They replied, "Jesus the Nazarene." He told them, "I am he." (Now Judas, the one who betrayed him, was standing there with them.) <sup>6</sup> So when Jesus said to them, "I am he," they retreated and fell to the ground. <sup>7</sup> Then Jesus asked them again, "Who are you looking for?" And they said, "Jesus the Nazarene." <sup>8</sup> Jesus replied, "I told you that I am he. If you are looking for me, let these men go." <sup>9</sup> He said this to fulfill the word he had spoken, "I have not lost a single one of those whom you gave me."

<sup>10</sup> Then Simon Peter, who had a sword, pulled it out and struck the high priest's slave, cutting off his right ear. (Now the slave's name was Malchus.) <sup>11</sup> But Jesus said to Peter, "Put your sword back into its sheath! Am I not to drink the cup that the Father has given me?"

Jesus Before Annas <sup>12</sup> Then the squad of soldiers with their commanding officer and the officers of the Jewish leaders arrested Jesus and tied him up. <sup>13</sup> They brought him first to Annas, for he was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, who was high priest that year. <sup>14</sup> (Now it was Caiaphas who had advised the Jewish leaders that it was to their advantage that one man die for the people.)

#### What is 'God's Wrath'?

Romans 2:4&5 Or do you show contempt for the riches of his kindness, forbearance and patience, not realizing that God's kindness is intended to lead you to repentance? <sup>5</sup> But because of your stubbornness and your unrepentant heart, you are storing up wrath against yourself for the day of God's wrath, when his righteous judgment will be revealed.
