


Structure/Plot of Esther (chiastic structure)



So the king and Haman went to Queen Esther's banquet, 2 and as they were drinking wine on the second day, the king again asked, "Queen Esther, what is your petition? It will be given you. What is your request? Even up to half the kingdom, it will be granted."

3 Then Queen Esther answered, "If I have found favor with you, Your Majesty, & if it pleases you, grant me my life—this is my petition. And spare my people—this is my request. 4 For I and my people have been sold to be destroyed, killed and annihilated. If we had merely been sold as male and female slaves, I would have kept quiet, because no such distress would justify disturbing the king."


Brilliantly, she left out Haman's identity in verse 3 so she could put a bow and arrow in Xerxes' hanks before she pointed him at the target. Had he known from the beginning that the culprit was his own right hand man, the king might have protected him. Instead, he'd virtually indicted him by the time she identified him. What could he do but follow through? And by the time she'd raised his ire through the palace roof, why wouldn't he want to?

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⁵ King Xerxes asked Queen Esther, "Who is he? Where is he—the man who has dared to do such a thing?" 6 Esther said, "An adversary and enemy! This vile Haman!" Then Haman was terrified before the king and queen. 7 The king got up in a rage, left his wine and went out into the palace garden.

8 Just as the king returned from the palace garden to the banquet hall, Haman was falling on the couch where Esther was reclining. The king exclaimed, "Will he even molest the queen while she is with me in the house?" As soon as the word left the king's mouth, they covered Haman's face.



Haman had committed an egregious error. According to some authors, touching the king's wife was penalized with death. In Assyrian law, no man was allowed to draw within more than seven paces of a member of the king's harem.

⁹Then Harbona, one of the eunuchs attending the king, said, "A pole reaching to a height of fifty cubits stands by Haman's house. He had it set up for Mordecai, who spoke up to help the king." The king said, "Impale him on it!" ¹⁰So they impaled Haman on the pole he had set up for Mordecai. Then the king's fury subsided.

9:20-22 Mordecai wrote these things down and sent letters to all the Jews in all the provinces, both near and far, of King Xerxes. 21 He made it a rule that Jews keep the fourteenth and fifteenth days of the month of Adar as special days each and every year. 22 They are the days on which the Jews finally put to rest the troubles with their enemies.

Experiencing REST in your Relationship with God
