

Now as they went on their way, Jesus




1. When we pray, there is nothing wrong with making our requests known to God. However, it's not difficult to go from requesting to being demanding. Be on guard against believing that God should adopt your best ideas about life and that He should carry out your desires.

<u>Luke 9:40</u> "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do all the work alone? Tell her to help me."

Martha has a prayer life, doesn't she? She comes and says, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to serve you alone? Tell her to help me." That's a prayer. But notice Martha is after *things* in her prayer. When Mary comes to Jesus, she's after *Jesus*, and that's all the difference in the world. - Pastor Tim Keller
