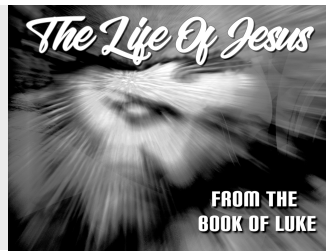

1. There are many things in life that we are blind to and can't understand until God opens our eyes, so ask Him to give you clarity!

Luke 10:22 All things have been given to me by my Father. No one knows who the Son is except the Father, or who the Father is except the Son and anyone to whom the Son decides to reveal him."

Disobedience and blindness: Deut. 28:29; Zeph. 1:17, Is. 6:9-10

God gives sight: Ps. 146:8, Is. 29:18, Is. 35:5, Matt. 13:13-17

The Messiah would restore sight: Matt. 11:5 = Is. 29:18

Ask God: Prov. 8:17, Matt. 7:7-12, Mark 10:46-52, James 1:5

2. At the center of the Christian life is forgiveness that Jesus purchased by dying on the cross AND the new life we have in Him.

Romans 6:2-4 How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³ Or do you not know that as many as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴ Therefore we have been buried with him through baptism into death, in order that just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too may live a new life.

2 Corinthians 5:17 So then, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; what is old has passed away—look, what is new has come!

3. What in the world could be more exciting than the news that *Jesus has risen from the dead*? It's no surprise that the people in the story could not help but rush to tell others! This story should challenge us to ask ourselves, "*what in life am I so excited about that it shapes how I spend my time, money and conversations?*"

1 Peter 3:15 set Christ apart as Lord in your hearts and always be ready to give an answer to anyone who asks about the hope you possess.

John 4:29&39 "Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did..."

³⁹ Now many Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the report of the woman who testified

-Why is Jesus sharp with the travelers, "*you are so senseless*"? (verse 25)

-What do the travelers mean by, "*were not our hearts burning within us...*?" (verse 32)

-Why does Jesus choose to open their eyes during the breaking of bread and not after explaining the scriptures? (verse 27 & 31)
