

4 Marks of a healthy Church.

-Acts 4:32-37

Therefore, they despised their own privacy and viewed all their possessions as common property!"

⁷ About three hours later his wife came in, not knowing what had happened. 8 Peter asked her, "Tell me, is this the price you and Ananias got for the land?" "Yes," she said, "that is the price." 9 Peter said to her, "How could you conspire to test the Spirit of the Lord? Listen! The feet of the men who buried your husband are at the door, and they will carry you out also."

¹⁰ At that moment she fell down at his feet and died. Then the young men came in and, finding her dead, carried her out and buried her beside her husband. 11 Great fear seized the whole church and all who heard about these events.

Acts 4:19 But Peter and John replied, "Judge for yourselves whether it is right in God's sight to obey you rather than God.


Acts 5:29 Peter and the other apostles replied: "We must obey God rather than men!"




my greedy lust for money is harming my family, my soul, and people around me."
